

Materials list for SDBA May Monthly Meeting Demo: Board Covering, Turn-ins, & Inlays, led by Amy Spencer

Please note, we are not completing a book this month, but rather making just covers and learning skills for future projects. Because of this, these measurements are *suggested*,* but really, you can make two covers, or even one of any size.

Materials:

PVA, with methyl cellulose optionally added

Two pieces of grain grain-long book board, 4 $\frac{5}{8}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ "

Two pieces of grain grain-long covering material – either book cloth or heavyweight paper, 5 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ "

Two pieces of grain grain-long end papers, 4 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 6"

Bits of paper ephemera with images that catch your fancy for the inlays. Simple shapes are easier and suggested if you are doing this for the first time.

Wastepaper for gluing and to prevent burnishing if applicable

Tools:

X-Acto-type detail utility knife

Bone or other folder

Glue brush

Scissors

Metal straight edge. It doesn't need to be ruled, but a metal ruler is fine.

*These sizes were chosen with two ideas in mind. One, in case participants don't want to choose a size on their own and two, that you might have a grain-long 9" x 12" pad of paper lying around to make a text block from in some undetermined future.
